

Lesson 28. Reflecting, Sharing, and Celebrating the Final Media Project

HAND OUT

Congratulations on your media project work. Reflect and explain your process for this work. Today you will have a variety of opportunities to share and celebrate your work.

Activity 1: Please write a brief reflection about the process and project of creating your media project.

Be sure to address the following:

- How did you define the MAPS of your media work? (Yes, you can just revise your original plans.) Defining the MAPS is part of the criteria for assessment of your work.
- What contextual information would you like your audience to know about your project? (You should already have some information on this, as part of the required assessment information.)
- What did you learn from this project in terms of your composing process?
- What did you learn from the creation of a final product?
- What is your reaction to your media work in terms of process and product?
- How did the media work impact your thinking about your inquiry topic?
- What argument does this media project suggest?
- What are the claims in the project?
- How does the media influence the message?
- Why did you select this media to present your research?

Activity 2: In literature circle teams, share your projects, providing any context needed for your work.

Respond to your peers. Identify the following for each composition:

- A compelling idea expressed in the work
- What you understood about the argument of the work
- Something you learned
- A compelling move in the creation of the piece (the role of color, visual design, audio, etc.)

Activity 3: Publish your work!

You can share your work on Youth Voices and/or our online class space. Be sure to revisit your reflection above to see if you would like to explain any aspects of your work to your audience.

Activity 4: Informally share projects with the class.
